In this session you will learn how to create rubrics in Schoology and then will have time to create your own rubrics within the platform.

Respondus LockDown Browser Beth Cummins	Room #207 Zoom Link	2:00pm – 2:50pm	Learn how LockDown Browser and Respondus Monitor protect the integrity of online tests in both proctored and non-proctored environments. LockDown Browser is a custom browser that locks down the test environment in Schoology to prevent cheating in proctored settings (e.g. classrooms, testing centers). Respondus Monitor builds upon the power of LockDown Browser by using the student's webcam and industry-leading video analytics. Respondus Monitor is a fully-automated proctoring solution that deters cheating during online exams. In this session we will talk about the benefits of LockDown Browser and demonstrate how to set it up in Schoology.
