LET US GIVE YOU CREDIT!

Southwest Tech is continuously establishing agreements with high schools to grant credit to high school students. See the chart for a list of current agreements.

TRANSCRIPTED CREDIT COURSES

- Are technical college courses taught at the high school using technical college books and materials.
- Are taught by your high school instructor who is also certified as a technical college system instructor.
- Help you earn both high school and technical college credit.
- Are provided at no cost to you.
- Are documented through an official college transcript which you may request after completion of the course.
- Are transferable to all schools within the technical college system and may be transferable to four-year colleges.

ADVANCED STANDING COURSES

- Are one or more high school courses that are equivalent to a technical college course.
- Are taught by your high school instructor.
- Help you earn both high school and technical college credit.
- Are provided at no cost to you.
- Are awarded if you successfully complete the course requirements according to the advanced standing agreement and enroll in a related Southwest Tech program within 27 months of high school graduation.
- Are recognized by "certificate of eligibility" for advanced standing.
- May be accepted by other technical colleges offering the same or similar course.

YOUTH OPTIONS AND COURSE OPTIONS

Attend Southwest Tech and High School, too!

Youth Options and Course Options are two programs available in Wisconsin that allow eligible students to take courses either on campus, online, or through interactive television and earn credits at Southwest Tech. Those credits can apply to both high school and technical college requirements.

For Youth Options, interested juniors or seniors should apply to their school district by March 1 for the fall semester and by October 1 for the spring semester. **For Course Options**, interested students should apply to Southwest Tech no later than six weeks before the requested course is scheduled to begin.

Your high school counselor can provide you with more details along with information on how to obtain the application form for each program.

WISCONSIN YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP CREDITS

Youth apprenticeship is a one or two-year program for high school students beginning in the eleventh or twelfth grade, offering students guided learning and work experience within an industry.

A student who successfully completes a state-approved youth apprenticeship will receive:

- A high school diploma.
- A certificate of occupational proficiency issued by the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development.
- Approximately three to eleven credits of advanced standing in a related area of instruction at any Wisconsin Technical College.
