

External Scholarships



Lands' End will award up to six (6) \$500 scholarships annually to graduating high school seniors and current college students continuing their education at an accredited college, university or technical college on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 credits).

Eligibility Guidelines:

- Students must have worked within Operations at Lands' End (Call Center/Embroidery/Distribution Center), minimum of 100 hours during the year prior to application deadline.
- Employment status is currently active or seasonal reduction in good standing.
- Student must be in good academic standing
- Currently enrolled high school with senior graduating status or attending an accredited college on a full-time basis.

Application Process:

- Complete an application via the link below
 - Eligibility will be verified by Employee Services
 - **Application must be completed by 5:00PM, January 20, 2023.**
 - Contact Recruitment with any questions Recruitment@landsend.com
- Employee Services will randomly draw the scholarship recipients and notify employees by February 10, 2023.
- Payment will be in the form of a \$500 to the Bursar's Office at college of enrollment. Payment will be made in February for currently enrolled college students or in September for graduating high school students or if not enrolled for the spring semester. Students must provide proof of full-time enrollment.

CNA Educational Reimbursement/Job Opportunity Provided through Upland Hills Health

Upland Hills Health is providing a scholarship opportunity for students that will be **graduating from SWTC in the Certified Nursing Aide course between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2023**. This opportunity will provide reimbursement for associated costs to the CNA program and onboarding to Upland Hills Health. The purpose is to help with a shortage of professionals in the healthcare workforce. Through this scholarship opportunity we are hoping to alleviate some of the burden to employees, their families and community members that wish to further their education and be employed by an organization that sustains a positive working culture.

We are looking for 12 students to be accepted from a Certified Nursing Assistant class through Southwest Wisconsin Technical College (SWTC).

The scholarship would cover the cost of tuition, textbooks, certification testing, and application fee while in the CNA course. Once on board with UHH employment, the reimbursement would cover a workshop training, BLS certification, pre-employment health screening, a uniform stipend of \$100 and a logo'd UHH bag.

Qualifications:

- Be enrolled in a class through Southwest Wisconsin Technical College (SWTC) between 7/1/21 and 6/30/23.
- Become Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) within 3 months of completing class.
- Would need to work a minimum of 500 hours or 1 year of service for UHH following completion of the CNA class and receiving certification.
- Certified Nursing Assistant Clinical Ladder/Bonus Program available.
- Meet necessary employment requirements such as background check, health requirements, reference checks, etc.
- Not eligible for any other reimbursement programs.
- Reimbursement is not provided until after hire with UHH and worked 30 days.

Scholarship Timeline

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for this scholarship, you must meet the requirements below. Please read the requirements carefully to ensure you meet eligibility before applying.

- Must be a graduating high school senior in your final semester who has been accepted to university or must be currently enrolled

in an undergraduate or graduate degree program at a 4-year, 2-year, vocational, or technical institution in the United States.

- Must be a US citizen or permanent legal resident.
- Must be a single father, child of a single father, or closely impacted by a single father.
- All fields of study and GPAs will be considered.

How to Apply

We know that single dads have a lot on their plate -- from raising a family to pursuing education and a career, all while defying expectations and forging their own path.

In your application for the **Little Bundle Superdad Scholarship**, we want to know how you do it. We want to hear about the challenges you've faced while juggling fatherhood and education, how you make ends meet, and what motivates you to keep going and keep dreaming. We'd love to hear about your relationship with your children and why you think that education is important -- not only to your life, but to their future, as well. Tell us what makes life as a single dad rewarding, and what special moments have stuck with you during your parenting journey.

We'd also like to hear from applicants who are the child or loved one of a single father. What challenges did your dad have to overcome? Are there memories from your childhood in which your "superdad" inspired you, or taught you a valuable life lesson? We want to know how being raised by a single dad has impacted your life and your plans for the future.

Whether you're a single father yourself, or the child or loved one of a single father, we especially want to hear about your dreams and goals. What do you hope to accomplish in terms of your education, career, and family life? What steps are you already taking to give yourself the best possible chance of success -- and how will this scholarship help you get there? We want you to think big and tell us where you see yourself in the future -- the sky's the limit!
