

10 Easy Steps to get your Driver's License



1. Take the Driver Education Theory Class.

(30) hours face-to-face class at your high school or take the class online. Click here to register or call (608) 822-2466 for questions.



2. Take the permit test in your class or at the DMV.

After successfully completing your face-to-face theory class, take the **Permit Test** issued by your instructor. All online students or students who choose not to take it in class will need to go to their local DMV to take the **Permit Test.** Click here for more info on the DMV permit requirements.



3. Register for Behind the Wheel Course.

4. Contact your instructor.

Contact your instructor, and request your permit application. Click here for instructor contact information.

6. Drive with your instructor.

Schedule road test with the DMV.

After completing 12 hours of behind the wheel a completion certificate will be emailed directly to the DMV. Click here to schedule a road-test with the DMV.



8. Pass your Driving Test
